What are Contextual Offers?

Sometimes called contextual admissions, they are defined by UCAS as 'where the university considers any barriers you may face, and will either reduce grade requirements or give extra consideration when deciding whether to give you an offer.' This can include guaranteed interviews and/or bursary funds linked to WP status. Some universities take into account whether a student has participated in their Widening Participation programme or summer school when making a contextual offer. You will need to add this to your UCAS application and if you require further information, contact the university's admissions department directly.

If you are already on the Sussex Inspires programme you will be contacted separately and do not need to fill in this form again.

Sign up to the Sussex Inspires Residential Summer School

We would welcome applications from students who meet our Widening Participation criteria, as outlined below.

Students who meet one or more of the following criteria will be given places as a priority:

- \cdot are in receipt of free school meals at any time in the past five years
- \cdot are a care experienced young person
- \cdot are from Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities

Our residential Summer School will give you the chance to experience student life at our beautiful campus. You will study topics within your strand, all delivered by academics. Throughout the summer school, you will work independently or in small groups on a short, university-level poster assignment. Alongside the academic programme you will attend a variety of social events on campus and in Brighton to soak up the student experience. You will stay for two nights in university accommodation, sharing a flat with other students on Sussex Inspires.

The Sussex Inspires programme offers students support, guidance, and experiences to help navigate their post-16 education options. It aims to help you make more informed choices about your future, and the steps you need to take to get there. Applying for the University of Sussex Inspires programme does not guarantee you a place on all of our activities. This will be subject to confirmation from the Sussex Inspires programme team via email. <u>Register your interest. The form</u> should take 5 to 10 minutes to complete.

Please be aware that the programme is only open for students currently studying in their first year of college or sixth form.

Optional events or trips

We may run some optional social events or trips throughout the programme and will communicate these with you in due course.



Students who are applying to Oxford or Cambridge this year, whether for an undergraduate course or a Foundation Year, they may be eligible for an extensive package of virtual support, including:

- Feedback on their Personal Statement
- Advice on preparing for Admissions Tests and Assessments
- Interview Preparation
- Pastoral support
- Signposting to other resources and opportunities

Explore Oxbridge takes place after school, mostly online. Students without access to a computer at home can arrange to use one at their local IntoUniversity Centre. As with our other programmes, students must meet the **IntoUniversity eligibility criteria** to take part and because the programme takes place mainly online, there is no limit to the number of students who can participate, nor is there a minimum number.

Summer School 6-11 July or 13 -18 July 2025

The deadline for applications is midday on 6th March 2025

The University of Nottingham Summer Schools offer Year 12 students the opportunity to explore the university experience in depth, while developing the skills and knowledge required to progress onto the country's top universities.

During the in-person summer school you will spend five days with the University and enjoy a varied programme of activities – academic, social and personal development – all for free! **Use the link below to check which week your subject strand is running in.**

After the summer school, you will have access to a wealth of UCAS resources and webinars – as well as direct chat with our student ambassadors – through Sutton Trust Online to support you through your higher education journey.

If you successfully complete the Nottingham Summer School, you will be eligible for an enhanced contextual offer (up to two grades lower, depending on course) and the Nottingham Potential Bursary worth £1000 for each year of undergraduate study!

To apply for the summer school, you must:

- be a home UK student in Year 12
- attend, and have always attended, a state-funded, non fee-paying school/college
- be studying relevant subjects in relation to the subject stream you are applying for

If you meet the above requirements, we will look at the following criteria when we consider your application:

- live in a neighbourhood with a low rate of progression to higher education and/or a high level of socio-economic deprivation
- would be in the first generation of your family to attend university
- have been in receipt of Free School Meals whilst at secondary school
- have achieved at least five GCSEs at grades 9 6 (A*– B), including English and Maths
- attend a school or college with a below-average A-level or Higher point score and/or a low rate of progression to higher education
- are (or have been) looked after, accommodated or in care
- under the age of 18 at the time of the summer school

Experience University - Southampton Residentials

Tuesday 15th - Friday 18th July 2025

This year you can join us on campus for a 4-day, 3-night programme. You'll get to meet our enthusiastic team of current students studying the courses you are aspiring to. You'll also meet with academics, researchers and alumni.

These residentials are free and open to Year 12 or Level 3 (Year 1) students who meet our academic and Widening Participation eligibility criteria (see below). You'll have free accommodation and meals for the duration of the residential.

We understand that travel costs can be a barrier when invited to attend a University residential. The university would therefore like to offer you the option of purchasing your train ticket on your behalf or a travel reimbursement of up to £100 for mileage costs.

Subjects for this years residentials are:

- Chemistry & Chemical Engineering
- Physics
- Mechanical Engineering
- Geography
- Modern Language & Linguistics

- English
- Business
- Music
- Biological Sciences
- History

To be eligible, you must be taking relevant and required subjects in relation to the taster degree subject session chosen. You must also meet at least one of the following Widening Participation criteria:

- You are an estranged student
- Your current home post code shows that you live in an area with low levels of progression to Higher Education. (Postcodes within the lowest 2 POLAR4 or TUNDRA (MSOA) quintiles: Q1 or Q2). Postcodes can be checked for eligibility on our Postcode Checker.
- Your current home postcode falls within the lowest 20 per cent of the Index of Multiple Deprivation identified as IMD Quintile 1 on our Postcode Checker.
- In receipt of a 16-19 bursary or similar grant OR received Free School Meals after the age of 14
- You live or grew up in Local Authority care
- Are a Young Carer

We prioritise students from state schools or colleges in the UK.

Ignite Your Journey

At the University of Southampton, we take a lifecycle approach to Widening Participation and Social Mobility. Our flagship programme Ignite Southampton allows us to offer sustained and sequential support to students from groups underrepresented in higher education.

Programme overview

Participants will take part in a number of activities to develop skills and knowledge around university level study, and help with their transition to HE.

Online learning module: You will complete an online learning module to prepare you for university and help develop some of the key skills needed for higher education.

Virtual Q&A sessions: We will host monthly live Q&As to connect you with experts on topics related to your journey to university.

E-mentoring: You will be matched with a current University of Southampton student who will be able to share their experience of university life and answer your questions.

Personal development opportunities: We will offer a range of opportunities which will focus on transferable skills to get you thinking about your employability and personal development.

On campus activities: We will offer you travel bursaries of up to £100 to enable lgnite your Journey students to attend one of the University's Autumn Open Days and/or an Applicant visit day, where appropriate. All participants will also attend a Transition and Skills event in April of Year 13 which will consolidate your online learning.

Summer School 15-17 July

The USW and Reaching Wider Summer School returns this July with a programme of exciting activities to give students a taste of life as an ungraduate student. Summer School will provide students with an authentic experience of university life. Along with two night's accommodation in our residential halls and series of social activities, students will have the chance to participate in subject-specific workshops and HE information, advice and guidance sessions. Students will also have the opportunity to connect with likeminded students from other schools and colleges, and meet our enthusiastic team of student ambassadors to get an insight into student life at USW.

Places will be allocated to Year 12 and Level 3 (Year 1) school and college students, however numbers are limited and priority will be given to students from groups currently under-represented in higher education, who meet one of the eligibility criteria detailed below and as per the University's 2023-24 Fee and Access Plan. **There is no charge to attend** the Summer School, accommodation and meals are included and we can also support with the cost of transport to attend.

Students who participate in the Summer School and enrol on a full-time 3 or 4 year undergraduate degree course in September 2025, will be eligible for the USW Summer School Bursary, worth £500.



Applications for All Access AUB 2025/26 are due to open in March

All Access AUB Participants will:

-Take part in a fully funded summer residential, exploring and experimenting with different mediums to build a strong portfolio of work.

-Have their work included as part of an industry-standard art exhibition at AUB's The Gallery.

-Be invited, alongside friends and family, to attend a celebration event of their work. -Receive one-to-one support from expert artists and designers in the development of their portfolio.

-Attend a 'transition to creative HE' event in their second year of sixth form or college. -Be given extra consideration at the point of admission to AUB, which, if an offer is made, will be a reduced conditional offer of up to two grades.

-Support from a dedicated progression mentor through the AUB application process and beyond.





Discover Bath

Discover Bath is a summer programme which aims to give prospective students a taste of first-year life and study at the University of Bath. You'll also have the opportunity to gain a reduced offer (see details below).

Discover Bath is free-of-charge, including on-campus accommodation, free meals for the duration of your stay, a programme of academic sessions (lectures, seminars, workshops) and fun social activities. Your travel to the University can be reimbursed (reasonable travel within the UK only).

Discover Bath is available to all Year 12 (or equivalent) students who are academically able to study at Bath in their chosen subject and meet our widening participation criteria.

If you do not meet our widening participation criteria then unfortunately you won't be eligible for Discover Bath but you may wish to consider our Step into Bath residential instead.

- You attend a school that's above the regional average in terms of the number of students eligible for free school meals or
- You would be the first member of your family to go on to Higher Education, e.g. to obtain a degree at university or through a degree apprenticeship

Residential Insight into University Courses -Summer 2025



Insight into University residential courses (previously known as Headstart) are summer schools run over 4 or 5 days where students get a taster of university life and an insight into a specific STEM subject. Students will get the opportunity to experience university style lectures and work on activities and group projects with the support of academics and student mentors. Students will stay in halls of residence and will take part in social activities in the evenings.

Applications for some of the summer 2025 summer schools are still open. For course more information on specific courses and requirements please see the course descriptions below.

National Residential Pathway

You can find further information about the Year 12 National Residential 2025, in the coming weeks including the subject strands, dates, location, and what to bring.

Subject Strands: We aim to place participants on their first choice of residential and subject strand, but due to demand and availability we are not always able to do so. In this case, we will place participants on their second or third choice of residential and subject strand. Please do try to choose a residential and subject strand (see lists below) for your second or your third choice that you would be just as happy to study as part of the Exeter Scholars programme. Also, when choosing first, second, and third choices for subject strands, do not select the same subject strand multiple times – this will not increase your chances of getting your first choice.

Code of Conduct: As part of the application, you will need to read and agree to the Residential Code of Conduct, which can be found below. Please ensure that you read and agree to this before submitting your application, as you will be asked to indicate your agreement as part of the application form.

IMPORTANT: The residential event is a compulsory component of this programme pathway, and without attending the residential, a student will not be able to take part in the programme.

ACCESS TO LEEDS SCHEME

Access to Leeds is our contextual admissions programme for UK undergraduate applicants. It offers additional consideration for applicants based on their personal circumstances.

If you join us through Access to Leeds, you will benefit from:

the chance to study an undergraduate degree with entry requirements up to two grades lower than our standard offer. For example if the standard entry requirement for your course is AAA at A-level, the Access to Leeds offer could be ABB.

a study module, support and events to help prepare you for university

on-course support through our Plus Programme

additional consideration if you apply for a means-tested scholarship.

How to apply

Applications open in September for the following academic year. Some students are automatically identified as eligible from their UCAS application, but if you meet the eligibility criteria, we recommend you apply directly as it guarantees you will be considered.

Access to Leeds applications open (late September).

Mid October

UCAS application deadline for medicine and dentistry courses (15 October).

Late October

Access to Leeds application deadline for medicine and dentistry courses (25 October).

Access to Leeds application deadline for all other courses (12 February).

Insight into University (previously known as Headstart) is a comprehensive virtual experience allowing students to explore STEM studies at university and the career opportunities that these subjects lead to. It provides access to information on university and student life, STEM projects and activities set by leading UK universities and global STEM companies, first year undergraduate lectures, live interactive sessions with academics, admissions tutors, employers and current students.

Every year EDT partner up with leading Universities across the UK including Cambridge, Sheffield, Lancaster, Abertay, UCL, Oxford, Liverpool, Edinburgh, Birmingham, Warwick, Kingston, Nottingham, Strathclyde, Plymouth University to give students an insight into STEM courses. Whether you are interested in life sciences, chemistry, biomedical, forensic science, robotics, food science, electronics, engineering, physics, computer science, sustainability, materials science, aerospace, built environment, tech or maths, we have something for you!

There are also fantastic workshops and careers guidance from organisations such as Innovate UK, GSK, GE, Tech Partnership, Rolls Royce....and more!

The unique feature of this course is that students are able to access content from a diverse range of STEM subjects and will be able to tailor a course that suits their interest.

Amazing Futures -SEND Opportunity

Amazing Futures is the name of the peer support project for young people with additional needs aged 14–25 in Brighton & Hove and East Sussex.

It's a youth-led project, connecting young people and empowering them to have a place where their voices are heard and valued, where they can be unapologetically themselves.

The project is for young people who have any kind of special educational needs or disabilities (SEND). Many of our services are available in both Brighton & Hove and East Sussex, but some are only available in Brighton & Hove at the moment.

The project started in April 2017, and currently includes:

- Activities and groups
- Wellbeing support
- Volunteering opportunities
- Youth Voice
- **Information through our website** on a number of topics, including daily living, education, housing, and health & wellbeing. This section is still growing, so check back soon for more!

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Support for those with Care Experience at / going to University

The Leathersellers' Undergraduate Student Grants Programme provides grants up to a maximum of £5,000 per year for a period of up to 4 years, (with a yearly review). The grant is unrestricted, and you may therefore spend it wherever your need is greatest, whether that be towards your living costs, equipment or travel for your course or fees etc.

Primarily we are looking to support those who are care – experienced. We know that people with care experience are under-represented at university, with much support ending at 18 or 25, so we deliberately have no set age limit.

We have bursaries available for UK and International students to enable them to attend our courses without charge or at a reduced cost. There are 400 free places available for those students requiring financial help if you are based in the UK.

In order for you to qualify you must meet **three** of the following criteria:

- Attending a publicly funded school or college
- Receive free school meals
- Be on track or have attained a minimum of 5 A*- B GCSE's
- First in their family to attend university
- Either parents in receipt of either Jobseeker's Allowance, Universal Credit or Income support.
